THANK YOU FOR JOINING US FOR WORSHIP TODAY. We are glad you are here! All that you need to participate in our worship service can be found in this worship booklet and in the blue hymnal (*The Hymnal 1982*) found in front of you in the pew. The worship booklet indicates which numbers to turn to in the blue hymnal when it is time to sing a hymn. All the other prayers and songs you will need are found in the worship booklet. Please follow along and join with us as you are able, and feel free to ask us questions about the service afterwards.

PRAYERS FOR HEALING AND THANKSGIVING: Members of the Healing Ministry will be in the South Transept (near the large image of the Blessed Virgin Mary) to offer prayers of healing or thanksgiving with you after you have received Communion. You can receive healing prayer standing or kneeling.

TO PARENTS OF YOUNG CHILDREN MAY WE SUGGEST: *Relax.* God put the wiggle in children. Don't feel you have to suppress it here. *Even if your children do not take advantage of the soft space, sit toward the front:* children will be more attentive when they can see what is going on. *Explain the parts of the service,* and help your child follow along with the printed parts of the service and the hymns. *Sing, pray, and respond.* Your child will learn by copying you. *If you need to remove your child from worship,* please do so, but please come back. You are welcome to walk your baby about in the narthex (entryway) or Grauer Lounge, (a speaker is available there so you can still hear the service) if need be.

Nursery: A nursery is available from Aug 13th-May 20th On Sundays from 9:30am-11am for children up to age 3.

Children's Formation Age 3-5th Grade | 1st, 2nd,4th, and 5th Sundays September-May

We gather in the Grauer Lounge at 9:30am. We then go to our two different programs from 9:45am-10:30am. Ages 3 through 6 attend our atrium. Grades 2 through 5 meet in our classroom.

Youth Groups (6th -12th Grade) | September-May | | Middle School Youth Group (6th - 8th grade) | | Meets every 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month. It consists of food, discussions, teachings, games, and fellowship. **High School Youth Group (9th-12th Grade) generally meets the 4th Sunday of the month. It includes food, discussion, fellowship, and outreach.**

ALL Y'ALL SUNDAYS | On All Y'all Sundays, the third Sunday of each month, the children are invited to join us in the back of the church prior to the service and process into church with us. They may sit on the floor in front of the altar with our adult leader for the first part of the service. They depart with the adult leader after the Gospel reading for an age-appropriate exploration of the day's Scriptures and prayers, returning to worship in time for communion. Nursery is also available for small children on All Y'all Sundays.

The First Reading

Isaiah 5:1-7

Let me sing for my beloved my love-song concerning his vineyard: My beloved had a vineyard on a very fertile hill. He dug it and cleared it of stones, and planted it with choice vines; he built a watchtower in the midst of it, and hewed out a wine vat in it; he expected it to yield grapes, but it yielded wild grapes. and now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and people of Judah, judge between me and my vineyard. What more was there to do for my vineyard that I have not done in it? When I expected it to yield grapes, why did it yield wild grapes? And now I will tell you what I will do to my vineyard. I will remove its hedge, and it shall be devoured; I will break down its wall, and it shall be trampled down. I will make it a waste; it shall not be pruned or hoed, and it shall be overgrown with briars and thorns; I will also command the clouds that they rain no rain upon it. For the vineyard of the LORD of hosts is the house of Israel, and the people of Judah are his pleasant planting; he expected justice, but saw bloodshed; righteousness, but heard a cry!

The Second Reading

Philippians 3:4b-14

If anyone else has reason to be confident in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on the eighth day, a member of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless. Yet whatever gains I had, these I have come to regard as loss because of Christ. More than that, I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things, and I regard them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but one that comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God based on faith. I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death, if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead. Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.

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The Holy Gospel

Matthew 21:33-46

Deacon: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew

*Assembly: **Glory to you, Lord Christ***

Jesus said, "Listen to another parable. There was a landowner who planted a vineyard, put a fence around it, dug a wine press in it, and built a watchtower. Then he leased it to tenants and went to another country. When the harvest time had come, he sent his slaves to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his slaves and beat one, killed another, and stoned another. Again he sent other slaves, more than the first; and they treated them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them, saying, 'They will respect my son.' But when the tenants saw the son, they said to themselves, 'This is the heir; come, let us kill him and get his inheritance.'" So they seized him, threw him out of the vineyard, and killed him. Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?" They said to him, "He will put those wretches to a miserable death, and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will give him the produce at the harvest time." Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the scriptures: 'The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; this was the Lord's doing, and it is amazing in our eyes'? Therefore I tell you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that produces the fruits of the kingdom. The one who falls on this stone will be broken to pieces; and it will crush anyone on whom it falls." When the chief priests and the Pharisees heard his parables, they realized that he was speaking about them. They wanted to arrest him, but they feared the crowds, because they regarded him as a prophet.





Grape juice is also available at the outside communion stations. If you would prefer to receive a blessing instead, you may approach a member of the clergy with arms crossed over your chest.
